Hello,

Thanks for your kind words. I hope the answers below could help you in your ePortfolio implementation:

- 1. As long as students access their college email, they have access to their ePortfolios. They have access to their email as long as they log in at least once a year. Ergo, if they access their emails at least once a year, then they can access their ePortfolios.
- 2. Our consultants have peripheral tasks such as helping update/maintain the ePortfolio website; help clean up survey data; coordinate ePortfolio events, such as student ePortfolio showcase, student club ePortfolio showcase, new student orientation; run programs such as the Scholars Program; design banners and templates; provide tech support to the Center for Teaching and Learning professional development seminars, maintain lab equipment and inventory, and all other tasks as assigned.
- 3. We evaluated around 10 platforms, where we asked both faculty and staff and students to user test these platforms. We had a list of criteria based on what we needed, to wit: ease of use, built-in assessment interface, customization and tech support. Based on the data, Digication came out as the platform that best meets our needs.
- 4. CTL started piloting eP in some courses taught by faculty who were ready to embrace innovative pedagogy. This was coupled with sustained ePortfolio driven professional development (see: http://www.laguardia.edu/2013-14 Professional Development Seminars/). While this was going on, CTL also closely collaborated with the different departments through their Chairs. The sustained professional development and collaboration was further enhanced with the support the ePortfolio Initiative enjoyed, and continues to enjoy from the College's administration, including our President.
- 5. I think it's best to establish first why you need ePortfolios in your institution. Is it for programmatic assessment (one of the key reasons why we're using ePortfolios at LAGCC), for student learning, to keep track of student academic growth, for transfer or even

career/employment? Of course, small details such as institutional mission and support, resources (money, labor, tech knowhow, etc), faculty and student buy in have to be factored in your planning.
